Featured Event: Studying Identity in a Global Pandemic

Recently, our global community has experienced a pandemic that has changed the ways in which we approach research, employ certain methodologies, and even the context for identity development. This featured event brings together a panel of researchers with diverse methodological expertise (quantitative, qualitative, and mixed methods) who will engage in a discussion of broad methodological, theoretical, and contextual issues that impact the study of identity in the current state of our global community. Following the panel, there will be small group discussions of related issues.

The program will include a brief business meeting following the panel discussion. The session will conclude with poster presentations (please see below for instructions for poster submissions). Shortly after the poster presentations, there will be a dinner to celebrate our coming back together!

The Program Committee invites submissions for the twenty-eighth annual ISRI meeting. The conference will be held as a half-day pre-conference in conjunction with the Biennial Meeting of the Society for Research on Adolescence. Membership in ISRI is not required to submit a presentation for consideration or to attend the conference. *ISRI is an interdisciplinary organization and strongly encourages submissions from a diversity of fields such as psychology, sociology, family studies, and anthropology.*

Instructions for Preparing Submissions

Carefully follow the instructions below while you are preparing your proposal(s). **Please note that some things have changed from prior years!** Proposals not prepared according to the instructions below will not be reviewed. If you have questions about how to prepare your submission, please contact the chair of the Program Committee, Megan L. Smith, mlsmith@boisestate.edu.

Proposals should address key issues of concern to identity researchers and theorists. ISRI is an interdisciplinary organization and strongly encourages submissions from all relevant fields.

Submission Deadlines

- **Wednesday, November 10th, 2021:** The submission portal will be open.
- **Wednesday, December 18th, 2021:** Rolling review of proposals will begin. *Please note that poster submissions must be in the required format to be reviewed.*
- **Wednesday December 29th, 2021:** Proposal decisions submitted by December 18th will be sent.
- **Tuesday, February 1st, 2022:** The submission portal will close.
- **Tuesday, February 15th, 2022: FINAL NOTIFICATIONS** regarding proposals submitted after December 8th but prior to February 1st will be sent to authors.

Submission Formats

- Traditional Posters
- Ask-A-Question Posters

Traditional Posters

Traditional posters include submissions focusing on empirical results or theoretical and pedagogical topics related to identity. All methods appropriate to the discipline, the data, and the issue under study are acceptable (including small sample, single subject, and descriptive designs). For empirical submissions, preference will be given to submissions with completed data analysis (due to space limitations), but submissions should summarize data already collected and must include sufficient report of data analysis for reviewer evaluation.

Submission elements include the following (have these ready before you submit):

- Poster title
- The name, institutional affiliation, and email addresses of all authors.
- A brief abstract (no more than 100 words), to be included in the conference program.
- A 500 word (maximum) summary of the presentation including the title, but no authors. You may include up to 2 graphics (figures/tables), which are excluded from your word count. **Do not** include names or other identifying information in your summary.

Ask-a-Question Posters

Do you have a question about your identity-related research that you would like to hear other people's opinions about? You can submit an "Ask-A-Question" poster. These posters involve an overview of an identity-related research situation leading to an unanswered theoretical or methodological question.

Potential question formats include but are *not* limited to:

What are the alternatives to [commonly used method] for analyzing data about [some aspect of identity]?

How can I ask parents about their children's identity development?

Should I use X measure, Y measure, or a different identity measure?

The poster must include a description of the research situation leading to the question as well as potential options that the presenter is considering. Poster session attendees, including experts in the field, will engage presenters in discussion about these questions and provide advice about potential solutions. *The questions should not have a single, simple answer*, but instead they should prompt numerous potential answers that can be compared. Submissions for this format should provide a brief overview of the research that leads to a question to be posed to attendees. The submission should provide preliminary consideration of some potential answers.

Submission elements include the following:

- Poster title (***MUST be phrased as a question***)
- The name, institutional affiliation, and email addresses of all authors.
- A brief abstract (no more than 100 words) to be included in the conference program.
- A 500 word (maximum) summary of the presentation including the title, but no authors. You may include up to 2 graphics (figures/tables), which are excluded from your word count. **Do not** include names or other identifying information in your summary.
